

PROCEDURE FOR: Treatment Planning Process: Interdisciplinary

POLICY: The care of all patients admitted to the Inpatient Psychiatric Units is guided by a comprehensive interdisciplinary treatment plan and a bio/psycho/social integrated summary.

POINTS OF EMPHASIS

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| <p>1. At the time of admission, the registered nurse admitting the patient completes the nursing sections of the Interdisciplinary Database including the Initial Treatment Plan with the admitting resident. The attending will review and approve the Initial Treatment Plan.</p> <p>2. Discipline specific assessments are completed on the Interdisciplinary Database under the appropriate sections (i.e. MD, OT, SW and Case Manager). Assessment information will be utilized by the Treatment Team to develop a comprehensive plan of care.</p> <p>3. During the first treatment planning meeting after the patient's admission, the "Interdisciplinary Treatment Plan (ITP) Face Sheet" and date of initiation of the plan are determined by the attending/resident psychiatrist.</p> | <p>1. The Initial Treatment Plan outlines pertinent nursing problems which will be addressed by the Interdisciplinary Treatment Team. Corresponding protocols are initiated and documented in appropriate areas of the Master Psychiatric Nursing Treatment Plan, along with Altered Health, Detoxification and Cognitive Impairment where applicable.</p> <p>2. ** Time Frame to complete Database within time of admission:

RN: 8 hours

Attending/Resident: 24 hours including patient physical

Social Worker: 72 hours

Occupational Therapist: 72 hours

** Exceptions may apply (i.e., patient refuses and/or is unable to complete secondary to clinical presentation.) - This will be noted on database dated, timed and initialed. Staff will attempt to obtain required information minimally every 8 hours.</p> <p>3. A five axial diagnosis is completed. Each team member initials and signs this page.</p> |
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4. During the first treatment planning meeting, the Interdisciplinary Team formulates a treatment plan corresponding to each active problem identified.
 5. By initiating the appropriate section and checking the recommended interventions, each discipline designates the plan of care to be accomplished.
 6. If additional problems are evident upon admission and at any time during hospitalization, the appropriate nursing problem(s) will be initiated and a treatment plan will be developed.
 7. During the second treatment team meeting, an integrated summary outlining the biological, psychological and social strengths and problems is discussed and completed.
 8. The Treatment Plan is reviewed by the treatment team minimally every seven days.
 9. Nursing protocols are reviewed on an ongoing basis and modified as clinically indicated.
 10. Upon completing the review/revisions, each member of the interdisciplinary team signs in the appropriate area. The date for the next review is indicated.
 11. Upon resolution of a particular problem (i.e., at the time of discharge), the RN completes the date resolved under each active nursing problem identified.
4. The plan includes measurable short and long-term goals and the dates by which each will be accomplished.
 5. Under Problem #1 (discharge planning), the recommended follow-up options and living situations are discussed and outlined by the treatment team. Nursing also indicates appropriate protocols which will continue to be utilized documenting of the appropriate Nursing Care Plans.

Further individualization of the treatment plan is accomplished by writing interventions for specific patient needs and pertinent goals (i.e., reverse checks, patient specific interventions).
 6. Specific interventions, including nursing protocols, will be initiated and documented in the Nursing Treatment Plan.
 7. Following the discussion of biological, psychological and social strengths and problems, this summary guides priorities for treatment.
 8. Patient status is assessed to determine progress toward recommended goals. Current goals are reviewed and revised accordingly by the team.
 9. Protocols in use may be discontinued and/or other protocols initiated according to the patient's progress. These changes are indicated in the "update" section of the Multidisciplinary Treatment Plan Review and the Nursing Treatment Care Plan.
